6. 1 credit of Fine Arts
7. 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 Scale
8. 27 or higher composite score on the ACT

By God's grace Sarah and Richard decided to leave the city of Toledo for Maumee. Around 1960 her husband left and she had the task of raising a 6 year old boy herself with no job or education. Although they were on welfare for a short period of time, Sarah got a waitressing job at a truck stop and then Toledo Country Club where she worked her way up to head waiter. She stayed there for 20 years, eventually retiring. Though she struggled financially during her son's childhood and especially during his college and medical school years, she taught him the resolve and dedication that if he worked hard and did well enough, he could one day be a doctor. She always put her son and his education first. Now a successful entrepreneur, philanthropist, inventor, renowned orthopaedic spine surgeon and owner of SpineCenterAtlanta, a comprehensive spine surgery practice with four locations and 150 employees and staff, Dr. Jim Chappuis, MHS Class of 1973 is pleased to support his alma mater and this deserving student through his endowment of the Sarah M. Chappuis Memorial Pre-Medicine Scholarship. Shortly before she died in 1997 she reminded him to "Never forget where you come from", and Dr. Chappuis hopes that this year's MHS seniors will also - one day - pay it forward by financially supporting their alma mater and the students of Maumee High School should they have the opportunity and blessing to do so.
