Dear Maumee Families,

We hope the transition to remote learning happened smoothly for you and your child(ren). Thank you for your flexibility as we made the change. We are all looking forward to being able to again offer in-person classes and January 11 still looks like our return date. In the meantime, our staff continues to work diligently to meet the needs of our students.

Even with the school district being fully remote, parents are asked to continue to report their children's positive and also presumed positive COVID-19 cases to school offices. School districts are still charged with reporting COVID cases to the Health Department and we are also charged with handling contact tracing in our community.

As some of you may know, a lawsuit was recently filed to lift the TLCHD order that mandated classes for grades 7-12 to be online as well as a pause of all school sports and activities. If the courts were to overturn this order, based on the community data and our school data shared last week, we will maintain our return date of January 11 for in-person learning. Also, if the health order is overturned or modified regarding athletics, we will work with the NLL related to allowing practices/competitions to resume; following revised safety protocols, and communicate this information directly to parents.

One question that has come up several times is, "Will we still have snow days?" Unless there is inclement weather that is bad enough to necessitate closing our buildings for all our staff members, we will provide online instruction. We will send out a school messenger notification to you if/when this would occur.

Please take advantage of our free breakfast & lunch program if this would be a benefit for your children ages 1-18. Program details are listed below along with the link to register for meals.

Reach out to your child's teacher(s) if you have any questions or concerns. **Student attendance is being taken each day during remote learning**. Our school counselors are also available to assist parents and students. You will find a staff email directory link below as well as each school counselors email with a direct link.

Please continue to check for emails from the district and school principals because we continue to have a great deal of information to communicate. The school district and individual school principals utilize SchoolMessenger emails for most of their correspondence with families.
