Dear Parents,

We have been looking forward to this milestone for weeks: our return to in-person classes. I want to thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigated through these unprecedented times. This Thursday we will begin to welcome back our student body with a staggered start. Students who have the last name starting with A-K will attend school for a full day on October 1. Students with the last name starting with L-Z attend for a full day on Friday, October 2.

Please note that some teachers may be giving limited assignments for the day that students are not face-to-face in school. Students should plan to use this time to catch up on assignments if they do not receive new schoolwork. Additionally, teachers may not be available for office hours on these days.

On Monday, October 5, all students in all grades who intend to transition to in-person learning will report for a full day of classes. For our MVP families - the staggered start back-to-school transition does not change any learning plans your teachers have put in place for you.

**Free Meals for Students** - The U.S. Department of Agriculture is permitting schools that are part of the federal free & reduced-price meal program to provide all students with a free breakfast and lunch every school day, regardless of income. This also includes Maumee Virtual Participants ( MVPs). Parents of MVPs will be able to pick up meals weekly on Mondays at Gateway Middle School. Registration for weekly meal pickup will be necessary and the Food Service Department will coordinate this directly with MVP parents. Students who will be returning to in-person classes do not need to register for meals. Breakfast and lunch will be available each day. Students may still pack a lunch.
